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SUMMARY MINUTES FOR THE MEETING OF ROTHERWICK PARISH COUNCIL HELD AT 7.30PM TUESDAY 27th FEBRUARY 2018 IN THE ROTHERWICK VILLAGE HALL.

Present – Cllrs Hugh Radesk (Chairman), Lucy Bardwell, Steve Burridge, David Dibbin & Daniel Margetson

Apologies - Apologies were received from Cllr Will Craven

Public Participation - Cllr Rob Leeson, District Councillor, Cllr Jonathan Glen, County Councillor
Cllr Rob Leeson confirmed that, if anyone actually witnesses fly tipping they can CALL 999 as they are actually witnessing A CRIME IN PROGRESS.

Minutes of the Previous Meetings – (a) Cllr Bardwell proposed and Cllr Margetson seconded that, the Minutes of the 17th January 2018 be approved with two typographical amendments. (b) Cllr Bardwell proposed and Cllr Margetson seconded that the Minutes of the EGM held on the 14th February 2018 be amended as discussed.

The 2018-2019 Budget was discussed and approved. (See Draft Minutes, Appendix Two)

It was **AGREED** to transfer £10,000 from the Lloyds Bank current account to the NatWest Business Reserve Account.

Planning

18/00070/HOU Carradale, Wedmans Lane, Rotherwick – for a single storey pitched roof front extension to form porch, entrance and additional bathroom space following demolition of existing porch. Alteration to existing rear porch. It was **RESOLVED** to offer no objection to this planning application.

18/00137/HOU Willow Bank, The Street, Rotherwick – for proposed rear orangery. It was **RESOLVED** to object to this Planning Application. (Please see the Draft Minutes for full response).

18/00171/HOU Nightingale Barn, Ridge Lane, Rotherwick – for construction of a detached oak framed garage. It was **RESOLVED** to offer no objection to this Planning Application.

Council Administration - Proposals & Resolutions

It was **AGREED** that Cllr Margetson would circulate to the Members a proposed response, from Rotherwick Parish Council, to the 'Hart Local Plan Strategy and Sites 2016-2032, Proposed Submission Version February 2018. It was further **AGREED** to call an EGM for Tuesday 6th March 2018 to review the proposed response and agree a final submission in time for the 26th March 2018 @ 16.00 deadline.

It was **AGREED** that Rotherwick Parish Council would submit their own response to the 'Hart Local Plan Strategy and Sites 2016-2032, Proposed Submission Version February 2018' and not accept the invitation to Co-Sponsor Winchfield Parish Council's response.

It was **RESOLVED** to purchase a replacement bench for the Playing Fields



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at a cost of £324.99 including delivery but plus VAT. The Clerk will place the order.

It was **AGREED** to decline an invitation to join a neighbouring Parish in submitting joint Planning Application responses. Discussion **AGREED** that individual Parish responses were easier to manage.

It was **AGREED** to accept The Mattingley Events Committee request to hold a joint community building Barn Dance on Saturday 28th September. Additionally, they are hosting a Picnic & Games on the Green at Hound Green on Saturday 14th July 12.30 – 15.30 to which all Rotherwick residents will be invited. After discussion Cllr Bardwell offered to act as Rotherwick's co-ordinator and would contact Leonard Crane directly.

It was **AGREED** that the Clerk would send Draft Minutes to the Chairman for review before circulating to all Members. The Final Draft, once issued, would only then be amended at the next Parish Council meeting. The Clerk met with the Internal Auditor on the 2nd February 2018 and her interim report upon receipt will be circulated to all councillors.

It was **AGREED** to defer, whilst information & guidelines are still being developed by HALC and SLCC, any necessary requirements to comply with the GDPR legislation which comes into force on the 25th May 2018. The Clerk & Cllr Burridge attended a course on GDPR and recommended that all Cllrs use their Rotherwick.org.uk email addresses and not their personal emails.

It was **AGREED** that Cllr Bardwell and the Clerk would meet on Friday, 2nd March to investigate a better working method for the Monthly Task List.

Village Amenities

It was noted and recorded that the Defibrillator, which is checked regularly by Richard Whistler & Cllr Bardwell (Lead Councillor) is in good working order.

Pavilion & Playing Fields

Quotations – Additional quotations are expected shortly for additional identified works. Upon receipt, and collation, discussions to agree how to move the project forward will be held.

Income & Expenditure – A 10-month Income & Expenditure Accounts for the period 1st April 2017 to 31st January 2018 were presented. These are for information only as all costings currently show in the full PC Accounts.

Charitable Trust – Additional documents have been shared with Members

for discussion and review.

Hudson Copse

It was noted that the last RPC inspection was carried out on the 23rd February 2018. Andy Frost has been contacted regarding the split in the foot of the 'grasshopper' bench but no action has taken place, councillors considered that the broken item is aesthetic only and therefore not a safety concern.

The Parish Council meet in the Conference Room of Rotherwick Village Hall at 7.30pm and all residents and press are welcome. 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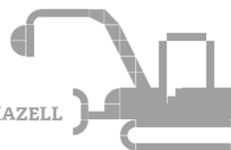
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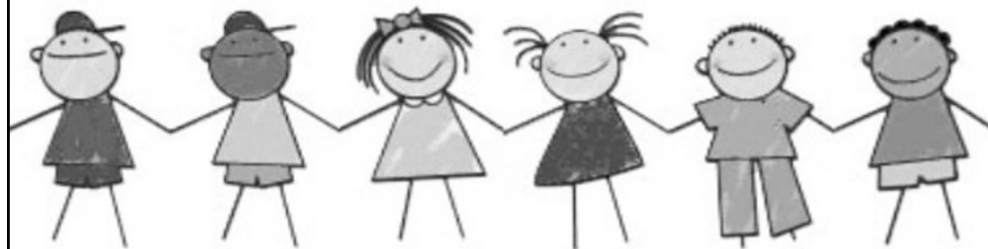
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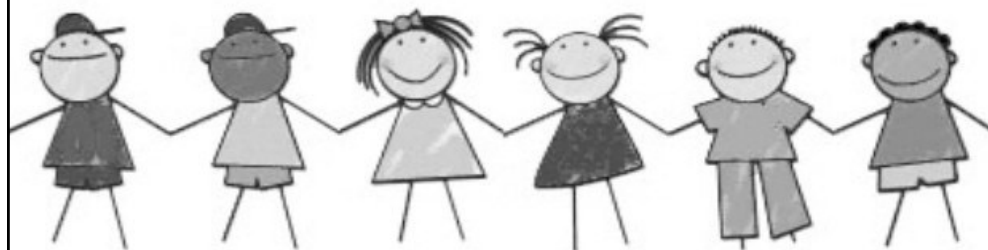
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Hook and Hartley Wintney Medical Support Fund

Whitewater Health has run a charity for the benefit of the patients since 1983.

The purpose of the charity is to provide equipment and services to our practice patients over and above what is normally provided in General Practice. We are very proud that over the years we have been able to purchase equipment to enable the doctors to perform investigations and treatments that would usually have to be undertaken at the hospital. This includes 24 hour heart monitors, 24 hour blood pressure monitors, an ultrasound scanner and a dermatoscope (to aid diagnosis of skin cancer) amongst many others.

More recently we have expanded the remit of the charity to deliver community projects. We have supported Whitewater Garden for Health which funds an allotment in Hook to benefit the physical and mental well-being of our patients. In conjunction with Odiham Cottage Hospital Charitable Trust we have also supported the LINK nurse project which has funded community nurses to support the elderly and frail in their own homes which has been a great success.

Our current goal is to raise money for a new device to help diagnose and treat asthma more effectively. The FeNo monitor measures levels of exhaled nitric oxide in patient's breath and is the most accurate way to monitor this condition. This is currently recommended as the Gold standard but is not available anywhere within local hospitals or GP surgeries. We want our patients to be the first to benefit from this. Each machine costs about £2000.

We also are raising money for a cardiac event monitor. This is to help diagnose patients who have heart irregularities that only occur occasionally. These can be very difficult to capture, and the monitor allows patients to keep in their pocket and press a button when they have symptoms allowing the device to capture the irregularity. This can result in better diagnosis of potentially life-threatening conditions.

Hook and Odiham RFC

February kicked off with a home match for Hook and Odiham against Eastleigh 3rd XV on 3 February. On 17 February we were back at Rotherwick Playing Fields although unfortunately our scheduled league opposition Romsey 2nd XV weren't there to join us, as they couldn't get a team together which gave Hook and Odiham a home walk over. With a full squad of home players eager to get a match however, Chineham very kindly stepped in at short notice to provide us with a friendly fixture played in beautiful sunshine in front of a good crowd of both home and away supporters. The home team used it as a good training op-

up with an end of walk pub stop, to give people time for a catch up.

Our Saturday walks tend to be longer, with fewer walkers, and can sometimes take most of the day. This last quarter our walks have included from Basingstoke to Greywell, along the Basingstoke canal, and Salisbury to Downton using the Avon Valley path

As well as the walks, the group also enjoys social activities, this includes an Annual Summer Picnic, Christmas Lunch, Boys lunches, Ladies walks, and lunches and the group occasionally organise weekends and days away.

The group have an active path patrol group, who report problems to the local council and also do some work on the paths, which can be as varied as checking waymarking and replacing waymarking discs, minor clearing or even repairing stiles and gates. To date this group has replaced 20 plus gates in conjunction with the local council. The latest task was building a sleeper bridge at Silchester.
